## God's Providence and My Worry

Robinson Crusoe found himself on a deserted island off the coast of South America after a violent shipwreck and was marooned on the island for 28 years. Once, while getting ready to eat, and in difficult conditions, Crusoe stated, "I sat down to my meal with thankfulness and admired the hand of God's providence which had thus spread my table in the wilderness. I learned to look more on the bright side of my condition, and less on the dark side, and to consider what I had, rather than what I wanted. And this at times gave me such secret comforts that I cannot express them. All our discontents about what we want appeared to me to spring from the want of thankfulness for what we have!" The author, Daniel Defoe, made a powerful statement about God! Do I trust God as much as Crusoe did even though I live in much better conditions than Crusoe faced?

What does the Bible say about God's providence? Job once asked, "Does he not see my ways, and number all my steps?" (Job 31:4) David asked, "You number my wanderings. Put my tears into your bottle; are they not in your book?" (Psalm 56:8). But the skeptic will say, look at the tragic events that still occur in the Christian's life! We must learn to trust God and trust in His unfathomable Providence. We cannot understand it, or most of the time even see it, but we must believe that it is there. Jesus calls our attention to Providence in Matthew 6:25, "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing?" Jesus understands the natural tendency we have to worry. But His instruction is to cast that worry aside. The Lord does not want us to be enslaved by worry, but instead trust in Him. Next week, we will continue this article by examining what Jesus goes on to say in Matthew 6 concerning our trust in Him.
