Prayer and Psalms

The Book of Psalms is a rich tapestry of prayer, adoration, and praise. Some psalms reflect a texture of deep despair, such as when David is surrounded by his enemies, and there seems to be no way of escape. Other psalms glow with a deep peace in the Lord's strength, such as when David thanks God for making Him king and strengthening his kingdom. So many others shout out with an exaltation of the Most High God. All of the psalms have down-to-earth expressions that share the range of human emotion and experience.

There is a common link between David's struggles and victories and our own walk as Christians. Perhaps that is why the psalms are so powerful. Our experiences in our own lives and the experiences of others who lived 3000 years ago are the same in so many ways. A great benefit of reading Psalms is experiencing these incredible prayers of people who are so like us. David and others reach out to God in every situation. We have powerful examples of what it means to adore God, to praise Him, to thank Him, to cry out to Him, or just to mediate on His goodness.

There are a total of 150 psalms. Within these psalms are patterns or similarities that bring some of the psalms together into sub-sets of the whole. For example, last Sunday night we examined the concept of adoration. We adore our God for His unchangeable characteristics. Three psalms in particular explore the rich attributes and nature of God, 103, 117, and 145. All three dwell on God's love and faithfulness, and there is praise for His righteousness and majesty. Psalm 103 includes one of the most powerful word pictures of God's compassion and forgiveness. In Psalm 103:11-12 the psalmist says, "For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us." What a beautiful statement of adoration for God! These thoughts explain one of His essential characteristics, forgiveness, by sharing with us the infinite separation that exists between the east and the west.

Tonight we will be examining the avenue of praise. Join us on Sunday nights to explore many ways that we can pray to God. Let's together commit ourselves to enriching our communication with God.
