R & R

An important theme in Scripture is that of work and rest. God created Adam and gave him an important assignment. Naming animals may not seem like a difficult task, but it was work nonetheless. Adam and Eve were tempted by Satan and committed sin. Work became an even more taxing situation because of their sin and the resulting difficulties. Work may have become more difficult, but the NT clearly tells us that it is important for us to work.

In many cases, work is seen as a form of obedience or even worship. Think about Noah building the ark for many years. His work was a sign of trusting God and believing that God would one day send the rain. Nehemiah oversaw the rebuilding of the walls of Jerusalem. Scripture tells of countless others who have worked hard as if they were directly serving the Lord.

Christians work is not just to give us something to do or to pass the time. We work to provide for our loved ones, make a contribution to our communities, and support our church. God’s desire is that we perform our work to the best of our abilities. Paul shares with us that we are to do the tasks given to us as well as we possible can. That verse is found in Colossians 3:23 and it is written with slaves in mind. Imagine what that means for us who work in comfortable buildings and much better surroundings!

2 Thessalonians 3 shows that there were Christians who refused to work and it was causing problems in the local congregation. The entire community suffers when some are not willing to work. Anyone who has ever attended a congregation where only the same handful of people served at every event understand how unhealthy that is to the kingdom’s growth.

This brings us to Labor Day. Rest is an essential part of work and Jesus, who worked hard, also took the time to rest. It’s the reason we all enjoy getting a full night’s sleep. When we prioritize rest, we give ourselves an opportunity to invest in the work we are doing. I know that when I skip periods of rest, my work suffers. So, if you are able to enjoy a break this Labor Day, take the time to make the most of it. Whether you have special events scheduled with your family or you’re just looking to take it easy, remember there is nothing wrong with rest!
